**Under this agreement for 2018
Happy Valley State School will receive**

\$180,484*

This funding will be used to:

- increase the percentage of students achieving 'C' or better in Mathematics in the Early Years to 86%
- increase the percentage of students meeting Upper Two Bands (U2B) of NAPLAN in Year 3 Reading to 50%, Year 5 Reading to 40% in 2018
- increase the percentage of students performing in the U2Bs of NAPLAN in Year 3 to 25% and Year 5 to 20% in Numeracy in 2018.

Our initiatives include:

- additional support to facilitate improved reading outcomes for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander and Early Years students
- professional development for teachers and teacher aides to build capacity in Quality Teaching and Learning with a focus on teaching deep learning in Mathematics
- building and developing teacher capability through coaching and associated support
- employing additional teacher time to provide intervention and extension in reading and mathematics
- the Head of Curriculum: STEM to facilitate the improvement of numeracy pedagogy within the school.

Our school will improve student outcomes by:

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| • Purchasing additional support time to facilitate improved reading outcomes in Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander and Early Years student reading. | \$40 000 |
| • Funding professional development opportunities to improve the teaching of literacy and numeracy and additional resources. | \$50 000 |
| • Employing an additional staff to provide professional support and coaching. | \$40 000 |
| • Employing support staff to implement intervention and extension programs for targeted students in Year 3-5 for literacy and numeracy. | \$50 848 |
